"Did You Know Where This Saying Came From..."

POSTHASTE



Meaning: With all possible speed. **Origin:** In the 16th century, the phrase "haste, post, haste" was used to inform posts (as couriers were then called) that

a letter was urgent and must be hastily delivered. Posts would then speedily gallop along a route with a series of places at which to get a fresh horse or to relay the letter to a fresh messenger. William Shakespeare was one of the first to use a version of the phrase adverbially in Richard II. "Old John of Gaunt ... hath sent post haste / To entreat your Majesty to visit him," the Bard versified. He also used the phrase as an adjective (a use that is now obsolete) in Othello: "The Duke ... requires your haste-post-haste appearance," Lieutenant Cassio reports to the play's namesake. Today, the word still possesses a literary flair attributable to the Bard.

READ THE RIOT ACT



Meaning: WHEN SOMEONE TALKS ABOUT BEING "read the riot act," it usually means they've been caught engaging in antisocial behavior and chastised accordingly.

Origin: These days, angry parents might threaten to "read the riot act" to their unruly children. But in 18th-century England, the Riot Act was a very real document, and it was often recited aloud to angry mobs. Instituted in 1715, the Riot Act gave the British government the authority to label any group of more

than 12 people a threat to the peace. In these circumstances, a public official would read a small portion of the Riot Act and order the people to "disperse themselves, and peaceably depart to their habitations." Anyone that remained after one hour was subject to arrest or removal by force. The law was later put to the test in 1819 during the infamous Peterloo Massacre, in which a cavalry unit attacked a large group of protestors after they appeared to ignore a reading of the Riot Act.

HOW TO CLEAN YOUR CHIMNEY

We were recently called in after a fire to restore the clothes, rugs and other textiles in a home that became contaminated with smoke from a chimney that caught fire. Fortunately, no one was injured but the house was a mess.
