BREAK THE ICE



Meaning: To commence a project or initiate a friendship.

DON'T THROW THE BABY OUT WITH THE BATHWATER



Meaning: Hang on to valuable things when getting rid of unnecessary things.

Origin: During the 1500’s, most people bathed once a year. Even when they did bathe, the entire family used the same tubful of water. The man of the house

bathed first, followed by other males, then females, and finally the babies. You can imagine how thick and cloudy the water became by that time, so the infants’ mothers had to take care not to throw them out with the bathwater when they emptied the tub.

CLEANING YOUR GRILL

The “experts” on grilling say you should clean your grill after each use by doing the following:

- Heat the grill in high for at least 15 minutes. Fragments of food will carbonize.
- Scrape the grates while your grill is still hot using an effective scraper.
- Mop the grates with a paper towel coated with canola oil using tongs to keep from burning yourself. This helps season the grates and reduces sticking for the next time out.

Depending on the type of grill you use, that are other tasks to address, like emptying the drip pan on gas grills and brushing out the bricks and ash after it cools to prevent the buildup from blocking the grill vents or causing flare ups.

If you are using a grill brush with metal bristles, I suggest you get rid of it immediately. These bristles will break off over time. If they get in your food, you can experience major internal problems that aren't always easy to resolve.
