Advice from a Rookie Cook

Cooking at our house was mostly something to provide nutrition. Not a science or an art. Just good food. No complaints. Food was served. I ate it.

During the pandemic, I decided to take online cooking classes to learn the right way to cook. I needed help because my knowledge of cooking was limited to scrambled eggs and popcorn.

Along this trail, I learned a few really important things that I'll share with you. For the rookie cook as I am, these were revelations. Experience is a great teacher so I thought I would share some of my new-found knowledge.

Fire is Hot!

Don't use a towel as a potholder. If you don't gather the full length of towel to lift a lid, it will catch on fire. And did you know that a potholder left too close to the flame will burn, too? I never knew that.

Fire Is Hot - Part 2

Pretty potholders and oven mitts don't always protect your hands. I learned that the closer the oven mitt fits your décor, the more likely you are to burn your hand when handling hot dishes.

Don't Grab Your Knife

If you place your chef's knife too close to the edge of your counter and it falls off the counter, don't grab it with your hand. It can

cut at least two fingers when you do that.

Grocery Shopping is Complicated

A little research found that a typical grocery store stocks 39,500 different items. That's a lot of items to sort through on shopping day. Did you know that my local Publix carries 14 different types of Cheerios (I counted them)? Did you know that there are 98 different canned tomato products that can all be produced with a fresh tomato? Almost all food items in a store can be produced by about 100 fresh items. Ingredients You Can't Overuse

Before I started cooking, we only occasionally, had pasta, potatoes, scones, or desserts at home. Unfortunately, I can quickly overeat carbs.

This led me to find healthier foods to bake, like carrots, zucchini, and pumpkin. I've learned to bake carrot cake, zucchini bread, and pumpkin pie!

“Did You Know Where This Saying Came From...”

A Dead Ringer



Meaning: An exact duplicate.

Origin: A ringer is a horse substituted for another of similar appearance in order to defraud the bookies. This word originated in the US horse-racing fraternity at the end of the 19th century. The word is defined for us in a copy of the Manitoba Free Press from October 1882: “A horse that is taken through the country and trotted under a false name and pedigree is called a ‘ringer.’” So, ‘dead ringer’ is literally the same as

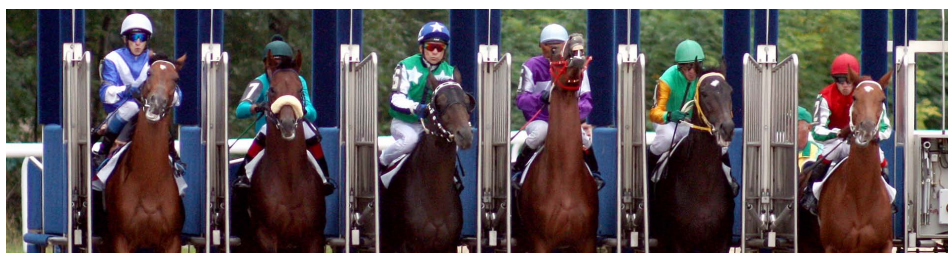
‘exact duplicate’. It first came into use soon after the word ringer itself, in the US at the end of the 19th century. The earliest reference found that confirms the ‘exact duplicate’ meaning is from the Oshkosh Weekly Times, June 1888, in a court report of a man charged with being ‘very drunk’: “Dat ar is a markable semlance be shoo”, said Hart looking critically at the picture. “Dat’s a dead ringer fo me. I nebber done see such a semblence.” That’s how they talked then--go figure!

A Dark Horse

Meaning: Someone who emerges to prominence; being previously little known.

Origin: This was originally horse racing parlance. A dark horse was one that wasn’t known to the punters and was difficult to place odds on. The figurative use later spread to other fields and has

come to apply to anyone who comes under scrutiny but is previously little known. Benjamin Disraeli provides the earliest known reference to the phrase in The Young Duke, 1831: “A dark horse, which had never been thought of ... rushed past the grand stand in sweeping triumph.”



REMOVING PERSPIRATION STAINS

As everyone knows, stains from perspiration are usually found on the underarm area of your shirt. However, any area of the body that contacts a garment can result in a perspiration stain.

Perspiration contains fats, oils, and moisture containing impurities that may vary from person to person. Using deodorant may help reduce a perspiration stain. But it does not completely prevent perspiration and may even add to the impurities deposited on your clothes. Perspiration stains may be invisible at first but with age and the heat of drying and ironing after cleaning can cause the stain to discolor the garment. An untreated perspiration stain on silk may cause the fabric to become weak and unable to withstand normal use.

In the case of a dry-cleanable garment, the stain can contain water-soluble impurities and which means it can often be removed by dry cleaning. We use special detergents and formulas to help remove perspiration stains. However, successful removal of perspiration stains is not 100% for every garment or every dry cleaner.

If you have a garment that you expect could have a perspiration stain, let us know because they may not be visible at the time of our initial inspection.

Your best bet to avoid perspiration stains is to wear tee shirts or perspiration shields under your better shirts and tops. However, proper cleaning should get 80% or more of these stains out of your clothing if treated when first contacting perspiration.
