Those are the Christmas feelings that have stuck with me over seven decades.

What I know is that Christmas is a time of slowing down, looking up, being present, and reflecting on your family, faith, and freedom.

# "Did You Know Where This Saying Came From..."

### **Lovey-Dovey**



**Meaning:** The affectionate stuff that people in love do, such as kissing and hugging.

**Origin:** The origin of this phrase is not clear. What we are about to state is obvious, but it looks like someone took the words 'love' and 'dove' and then added the letter 'y' to the end of them. Perhaps this was done to make them sound cuter. Why combine these two words, though? Well, the dove bird is sometimes used as a symbol for love, so that might have something to do with it, and there's also the whole thing where these words rhyme with one another.

Alright, so not much is known about this expression. What I do know, however, is that this saying has existed for around 200 years, at least, possibly longer. For example, The Metropolis, a book published in 1819, there's a part from it that reads: "My dearest love--lovey, dovey, or odious duckey!" However, apparently the phrase goes back even further than that, by 60 years, as claimed by Robert Hendrickson in the Facts on File of Word and Phrase Origins: "It is recorded first in England in 1769 as a term of affection: 'The domestic Lovies and Dovies.' "

### **Love-Birds**

**Meaning:** A pair of people who have a shared love for each other.

**Origin:** Lovebirds are small parrots that are very fond of their mate. They get their name from the strong affection they show for their partner, often sitting next to them for lengthy periods of time. Aw, how adorable! Well, it would seem that at some point, people who were showing affection for one another began being compared to a couple of lovebirds. An early example of this that we found in writing comes from the Burlington Hawk Eye newspaper,



1897: "The two Norwegians sat on a chest side by side, alike and placid, resembling a pair of love-birds in a perch."

# WHEN YOUR CLEANING MACHINES GET STINKY

Even the machines you use to clean can get dirty and stink. Here are some easy ways to fix this stinky problem.

#### Dishwasher

Remove the filter along with any built up food or gunk. Wash the filter under warm water, wipe out the gunk in the filter recess, and replace the filter. Wipe down the floor in the dishwasher, especially in the corners.

When translated from the Hebrew word Messiah, it means "anointed". The last part of Christmas--maesse--comes from the Latin word "missa", which is the celebration of the

Eucharist tradition of eating bread and drinking wine.
