Love Your Clothes: Prepping for Valentine's Day ~ Cleaning Tips for Special Outfits

PREPARATION TIPS FOR DATE-NIGHT ATTIRE

Silk and Satin: Luxurious and delicate, these fabrics require special attention. Handwash with mild soap or use a silk-specific detergent. Avoid wringing them and instead gently press out excess water. For many of these garments, dry cleaning may be the best choice.

Wool and Cashmere: Keep these cozy fabrics fresh by dry cleaning or handwashing with a wool-specific detergent. Lay them flat to dry to maintain their shape.

STAIN REMOVAL HACKS - Valentine's Day mishaps are common, but they need not ruin your evening. Quick action and the right techniques can save your outfit from stains. Avoid heat from drying and ironing as heat will make stains tougher to remove.

Chocolate: Dab the stain with cold water and gently rub with a mixture of mild soap and water. Avoid hot water, as it can set the stain.

Wine: Blot the area with a clean cloth and sprinkle salt to absorb the excess liquid. Then, gently dab with club soda or white wine vinegar.

Oil-based stains: Sprinkle talcum powder or cornstarch on the stain to absorb the oil. Brush off gently and apply a stain remover before washing.

HANDLING DELICATE FABRICS - For delicate fabrics like lace, chiffon, or tulle often found in romantic outfits, extra care is crucial:

Lace: Handwash with mild detergent and avoid twisting or wringing it. Lay flat to dry on a towel.

Chiffon: Use a mesh laundry bag for machine washing on a gentle cycle. Air dry to avoid damage from heat

Tulle: Spot clean with a damp cloth and mild soap. Avoid washing machines to prevent tears.

Last-Minute Cleaning Solutions - In the event of a last-minute stain emergency:

Blot, Don't Rub: Whether it's wine, sauce, or makeup, resist the urge to rub vigorously. Blot gently to prevent the stain from spreading.

BITE THE BULLET




Meaning: Accepting something difficult or unpleasant

Origin: There was no time to administer anesthesia before emergency surgery

during battle. The surgeon made patients bite down on a bullet in an attempt to distract them from the pain. In history, wooden sticks are known as billets, the stick-biting practice might have first been called 'biting the billet' which then modified to 'biting the bullet'. Worth investigating certainly, but there are no records of the phrase 'bite the billet' can be found in historical newspapers and other records. Rudyard Kipling wrote a dialogue in the 1891 novel The Light That Failed: "Steady, Dickie, steady!' said the deep voice in his ear, and the grip tightened. 'Bite on the bullet, old man, and don't let them think you're afraid."

BREAK THE ICE



Meaning: To commence a project or initiate a friendship

Origin: Before the days of trains or cars, port cities that thrived on trade suffered during the winter because frozen rivers prevented commercial ships from entering the city. Small ships known as "icebreakers" would rescue the icebound ships by breaking the ice and creating a path for them to follow. Before any type of business arrangement today, it is now customary to "break the ice" before beginning a project. It wasn't until the latter part of the 17th century that it took on its current meaning of 'establish a relaxed relationship in socially awkward situations'; for example, Samuel Butler's Hudibras, 1678:"The Oratour - At last broke silence, and the Ice."

BLOOD IS THICKER THAN WATER



Meaning: Family comes before everything else

Origin: In ancient Middle Eastern culture, blood rituals between men symbolized bonds that were far greater than those of family. The saying also has to do with "blood brothers," because warriors who symbolically shared the blood they shed in battle together were said to have stronger bonds than biological brothers. The first example of the proverb 'blood is

thicker than water' that I can find in print in English is in Allan Ramsay's Collected Scots Proverbs, 1737: "Blude's thicker than water." There are claims made that an earlier form of this phrase existing in Middle German in the 12th century and appear in Heinrich der Glîchezære's epic Reinhart Fuchs, circa 1180. The English version of that text is translated as "I also hear it said, kin-blood is not spoiled by water.
